



Bylaw No. 111

TRUSTEE ELECTIONS

The following is a Bylaw to establish procedures for the conduct of trustee elections.

The Board of Education of School District No. 87 (Stikine) wishes to establish procedures and requirements under the authority of the *School Act* for trustee elections.

REGULATIONS

In School District No.87 (Stikine), trustee elections are held in the following trustee electoral areas (more fully described in Ministerial Order 337/1999):

<u>Area</u>	<u>Trustee electoral area</u>	<u># of trustees</u>
A	Atlin and surrounding area	one
B	Lower Post/Good Hope Lake/Fort Ware and surrounding area	one
C	Dease Lake and surrounding area	one
D	Telegraph Creek and surrounding area	one
E	Iskut and surrounding area	one

1. Definitions

- 1.1 The terms used shall have the meanings assigned by the *School Act* and the *Local Government Act*, except as the context indicates otherwise.
- 1.2 "Election" means a trustee election.
- 1.3 "Board" or "school board" means the Board of Education of School District No.87 (Stikine).
- 1.4 "Minister" means the Minister of Education and Child Care.

2. Application

This bylaw applies to both general elections and by-elections and to those trustee elections carried out by other authorities, except as otherwise indicated.

3. Public Notice Posting Places

For the purpose of trustee elections conducted by the Board, the following are designated as public notice posting places for the purposes of *Section 50* of the *Local Government Act*:

- 3.1 the noticeboard located in the common area of the Board's head office in Dease Lake; and
- 3.2 at the local post office sites in each community within the District:
 - 3.2.1 Atlin
 - 3.2.2 Lower Post
 - 3.2.3 Good Hope Lake
 - 3.2.4 Fort Ware
 - 3.2.5 Dease Lake
 - 3.2.6 Telegraph Creek
 - 3.2.7 Iskut

4. Publication by Means other than Newspaper

The Board designates the following means of publication of notices required to be published pursuant to *Section 94.2* of the *Community Charter*:

- 4.1 the Board's website www.sd87.bc.ca, and
- 4.2 the District's School FaceBook pages.

5. Order of Names on the Ballot

The order of names of candidates on the ballot will be alphabetical as per *Section 116* of the *Local Government Act*.

6. Required Advance Voting

An advance voting opportunity will be held on the tenth day before general voting day, unless exempted by an order of the Minister, and no other advance voting opportunities will be held.

7. List of Voters

Pursuant to *section 64* of the *Local Government Act*, the most current available Provincial list of voters prepared under the *Election Act* is the register of resident electors for School District No 87 (Stikine). The Provincial list of voters will become the register of resident electors effective 52 days before the general voting day for any election to which this bylaw applies.

8. Public Access to Election Documents

- 8.1 The Board authorizes public access to the nomination documents of the trustee candidates during the regular office hours at the Board's head office from the time the nomination documents are delivered until 30 days after declaration of the election results.
- 8.2 The Board will make available to the public by internet access, without

charge, during the regular office hours of the Board’s head office, the disclosure statements or supplementary reports required to be made available by the BC Chief Electoral Officer on an Elections BC authorized website, other than:

- 8.2.1 a mailing address or residential address of a significant contributor, or
- 8.2.2 a telephone number, mailing address, or residential address of a candidate,

until five (5) years after general voting day for the election to which the trustee’s reports relate.

9. Title

This bylaw may be cited as “***School District No 87 (Stikine) Trustee Election Bylaw No.111***”.
